



YUKON ENERGY SCHOLARSHIPS TR'ONDËK HWËCH'IN FIRST NATION

- Annual scholarship of up to \$1,000
- Open to beneficiaries of the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in First Nation
- Must be studying at a post-secondary institution for a certificate, diploma or undergraduate degree

Yukon Energy is offering annual scholarships totaling \$3,000 to beneficiaries of the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in First Nation. This is part of the Mayo-Dawson City transmission line benefits agreement. An eligible student may receive up to \$1,000 over a school year.

Who may apply?

You must be a beneficiary of the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in First Nation and must be accepted or enrolled at an accredited post-secondary institution in part-time or full-time studies for a certificate, diploma or undergraduate degree. Graduate programs and studies normally requiring undergraduate degrees such as law or medicine are ineligible.

Past and current recipients of other scholarship programs offered by Yukon Energy are ineligible for the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in First Nation component of the Yukon Energy scholarship.

When is the application deadline?

All applications must be received by 4 p.m. on June 30.

How does the selection process work?

A selection committee comprised of Yukon Energy and Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in representatives will review applications. Priority may be given to applications for studies in the sciences, engineering, technologies, commerce, economics, or First Nation, public and business administration.

Evaluations will consider academic performance and citizenship, including extracurricular activities in school and involvement with the First Nation and local community.

The selection committee may require an interview with applicants. Failure to participate by phone or in person for an interview may result in scholarship ineligibility.

The proceedings of the selection committee are confidential and its decisions are final.

When are the scholarships awarded?

Scholarships are awarded by late August. You will be informed in writing of the selection committee's decision.

If you are chosen as a recipient, you will receive half of the funds in September and the other half in January, once confirmation of your course participation is received.

The Yukon Energy scholarship is classified as income by Revenue Canada and must be declared when filing an income tax return. The program coordinator will provide you with a T-4A slip before the end of February.

What else should you know?

You must begin your studies within six months of being awarded a scholarship. In the event that you withdraw from full-time studies at any point, you must immediately return any unused portion of the scholarship. Failure to do so may result in future ineligibility to the program.

Scholarship recipients and other applicants may re-apply to the program each year provided they continue to meet the criteria.

You are solely responsible for insuring that your application is complete and contains all necessary documentation. Incomplete or inconsistent applications may be disregarded by the selection committee. Applications and accompanying documentation will not be returned.

You may be asked to participate in publicity and promotional events sponsored by Yukon Energy.
